## **GROWER ENGAGEMENT**

## SALE OF WOOL

Wool will be offered for sale in the spot market predominantly using an online sales platform or by private arrangement on a weekly basis to a full selection of buyers. Payment will be 10 working days from the sale date or sooner.

As wool will be sold physically sitting at our Timaru or Napier woolstores, which are near our scours, growers will receive improved pricing compared to selling wool that is lying in other locations.

# **WOOL SPECIFICATION SHEETS**

Wool Specification Sheets are the key initial traceability document. It is important that it is completed correctly. To avoid delays we need to ensure our woolstore staff have all the information needed to unload, receive, and process your wool efficiently once it is in our care.

To this point we kindly ask:

- Please email a completed wool Speci sheet to us as soon as practical once the truck leaves your farm.
- Please ensure the number of bales on the truck matches what is on the wool Speci sheet.

# **INSURANCE**

You are responsible for insuring your wool from the time it is received into our woolstore up until it is sold and paid for by the purchaser. For this reason, there will be no insurance deductions from the Account Sale.

# WOOL PREPARATION – MAXIMISE YOUR RETURNS

- Please aim for bales weights in the 160-180Kgs range, and ensure wool packs are in satisfactory condition
- Do not exceed 200Kgs, and likewise light or soft bales can cause issues with transportation and storage.
- Please remind your shearing contractor to ensure bales are free from contamination.
- Price premiums can be achieved for well-prepared, well graded/classed lines of wool.
- If in doubt leave it out.
- Please contact us in advance of shearing if you require our wool classing advice.
